





TOURNAMENT RULES

1. THE TOURNAMENT

The competition will be held over three days, Friday 13th Saturday 14th and Sunday 15th February 2026.

2. THE COMPETITION

The competition will be for both Tag & Release and Capture and will be fished as per the GFAA & NSWGFA rules – Point scores – Tackle regulations. Line classes to be fished are 4kg, 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg.

Small fry anglers are restricted to a maximum 10kg line class

Billfish Shootout Minimum Weights – see below

Species eligible for Capture in the tournament are Marlin. Note: Marlin -As per NSWGFA minimum weights.

Species Eligible for Capture in the tournament are Shark (Excluding Scalloped, Great hammerhead and Great white sharks). Note: Shark – exceeding 350kg on any line class.

Species eligible for Tag and Release Are Marlin, Sailfish, Broadbill Swordfish & Short Bill Spearfish.

CIRCLE HOOKS ONLY are permitted to be used for live baiting and trolling natural baits (**whether live, dead, mutilated or dissected**) NB: No points to be scored for any species caught while using live baits and/or trolling natural baits with "J" hooks.



CIRCLE HOOK DEFINITION

A hook with its point turned 90 degrees or less back towards the shank of the hook.

3. ENTRIES



Eligibility

All anglers are to be financial members of a club affiliated with NSWGFA, GFAA, ANSA or IGFA. (**Penalty:** Automatic disqualification of the vessel from the tournament. This includes ineligibility for any boat prizes not yet awarded at the time of disqualification.) ANSA Members wishing to fish for the tournament must fish on an NSWGFA Club Registered Boat.

The tournament committee reserves the right (at its absolute discretion) to refuse to accept entry to the tournament from any boat and/or angler. The tournament committee is not required to provide a reason for its decision.

Entry fees

2026 BILLFISH SHOOTOUT

The Team Captain, skipper and any person assisting in (or involved in affecting) a capture or tag & release must be a competing angler that has paid the applicable entry fee. (Penalty: Automatic disqualification of the vessel from the tournament. This includes ineligibility for any boat prizes not yet awarded at the time of disqualification.)

There must be a minimum of **three (3)** registered anglers onboard each boat under 8 meters and **four (4)** registered anglers onboard each boat 8 meters and over. The maximum limit to the number of anglers on each boat shall be as per the limit imposed by vessel capacity plate.

Entry fees are **\$260.00 (Inc. GST) includes presentation ticket, tournament shirt** and **\$110.00 (Inc. GST)** for each junior angler (under 16 years of age at the start of the Tournament).

The entry fee includes tournament clothing, briefing, and boat team kit, angler draws.

Please Note: Presentation tickets are limited to the first 105 boats, boats that entered after this cut off are invited to the presentation, drinks and buffet-style snacks will be supplied.

Late entries

Entries close on Tuesday 10th February 2026 at 5pm. Entries submitted after this date will incur a late entry fee of \$30.00 per angler. Late entries will be accepted up until the commencement of the briefing Thursday 12th February 2026.

(Note: Tournament clothing may not be available for late entrants at the briefing)

4. FISHING DAYS & TIMES

Friday 13th 8.30am to 4.00pm, 8.00am to 4.00pm Saturday 14th, 8.00am to 3.30pm Sunday 15th February 2026.

Boats cannot commence burleying, trolling or fishing before the Radio Operator announces the official start of fishing.

(Note: Collection of live bait prior to the official start is permitted).

Any hookups prior to the end of fishing on Saturday that has been reported to and acknowledged by radio base (Game Fish Base), may be fought out. Fish hooked prior to the end of fishing on Sunday that has been reported to and acknowledged by radio base can be fought out if the tag card/capture is at the weigh station by 5.00 pm.

(Note: Weigh station is deemed to be Fly Point.)

5. FISHING AREA (TOURNAMENT BOUNDARIES)

The Fishing area for the tournament is South to latitude 33 degrees 15 minutes (Bird Island) and North to latitude 32 degrees and 13 minutes (Latitude Rock)

6. LEAVING PORT

Boats may fish from their home port on Friday 13th February but CANNOT commence burleying, trolling or fishing until:

- The Radio Operator announced the official start of fishing at 8:30 am, AND
- The boat is located within the prescribed fishing area (tournament boundary).

7. RETURN TO PORT

On Friday 13th, Saturday 14th and Sunday 15th February, ALL boats must return to the Club's port at Port Stephens. Failure to report on your return may invoke a penalty.



8. SALE OF FISH

Any fish weighed shall not be sold or bartered. Such fish shall be ineligible for any trophies or awards. Any person or boat entered in the tournament found to have sold or bartered their catch will be disqualified from the tournament.

9. FISH HANDLING

All fish should be removed from the weigh station after weighing *unless requested by a scientific research official and permitted/confirmed by a tournament official (Safety of the crew is paramount - if the boat is incapable of disposing of the fish safely you must inform a tournament official to organise an alternative)*. Competitor and boat crews must not clean or fillet fish, in the vicinity of the weigh station, not at any time near any beach or Harbour foreshore area. Unwanted fish must be taken at least 3nm outside the port and disposed of in an appropriate manner. **NOTE: FISH MUST NOT BE DISPOSED OF IN A MARINE PARK:** In the event of any shark or marlin gave away for eating, only the fillets may be given, and the remaining carcass is the responsibility of the skipper and crew. Failure to comply with rule 8 may incur a penalty (Discretion of tournament committee)

10. WEIGH STATION PROCEDURES

Once boats enter the vicinity of the weigh station, they are under the control of the Tournament Official at the Weigh Station and MUST obey all instructions issued by the Official. Before coming alongside the weigh station, boats must have, all equipment used to affect the Capture or Tag & Release ready for inspection and have completed all applicable paperwork.

11. LAWFUL CONDUCT

Compliance with NSW and Australian Laws

All boats, skippers and crew members must comply with applicable Australian and NSW state regulations, including but not limited to current valid licenses (e.g. boat operation, NSW fishing, marine radio operator). The tournament committee reserves the right to inspect licenses of all members of a competing crew. Failure to provide this documentation and notification of a breach by the regulatory authority (e.g. police, maritime, etc.) Will result in immediate disqualification from the tournament.

Seaworthiness of vessels/boats

All boats must comply with NSW Maritime Authority regulations, for safety equipment and safety standards.

All boats must carry a 406 MHz EPRIB and have two working marine radios fitted one of which must be VHF frequency.

A Boat Safety Form is included as part of the entry form and must be completed and signed by the boat skipper.

12. CONDUCT

It is an expectation that all participants will conduct themselves in a responsible and courteous manner to Tournament Officials and other Competitors at all times throughout the tournament. Penalties for misconduct may include disqualification from the tournament.

13. MISCONDUCT

The Tournament Committee may on its own initiate investigation and act upon any incident of misconduct by an angler on a boat, be he/she registered for the tournament or not occurring during the tournament. The committee may impose penalties of loss of points, disqualification of fish, angler, boat or team and refusal of entry to any future club tournaments. All competitors are reminded that as members of a club they are regarded as representatives of that club, as such any unbecoming behavior reflects adversely on the club and indeed on all Game Fishers, hence, the tournament Committee reserves the right to take any action it deems necessary in these circumstances.

14. DISPUTES OR PROTESTS

Disputes or protests must be presented in writing to the Tournament Committee by 6.30pm on the day in question. The dispute will be considered by a minimum of 3 members of the Tournament Committee, one of whom shall be the NPSGFC President. Protests cannot be made anonymously, and the other party shall be given the right of reply in writing. Both parties may be called upon to present their case to the review committee.

THE DECISIONS OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE WILL BE FINAL.



15. INSURANCE

Each vessel is to have their own Third-Party Liability insurance and Boat Owner must provide details of insurance covering third party property liability and third-party personal liability insurance (**minimum \$5 million**) on the 'Boat Safety Rescue Form'.

16. BRIEFING

There will be a tournament Briefing on Thursday 12th February 2026 Soldiers Point Bowling Club 118 Soldiers Point Rd, Soldiers Point NSW at 7:00 pm.

Boats that plan to commence fishing from Port Stephens must have an entered angler from the boat attend the briefing. Tournament bags will be issued at the briefing. Only boats that nominate on the entry form that they will commence fishing on day 1 from another port are exempt from attending the briefing, (**Boats who do not attend the briefing must download a sked map from the club's website www.npsgfc.com**). Tournament bags for these vessels will be available from the tag return and weigh station on day 1.

Please Note: You must be present to claim boat and angler prize draws

17. POINTSCORE

Point score will be as per the NSWGFA Point score System. In the case of a tie, the angler or team to reach the tied score first will be deemed the winner.

18. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Will be conducted in accordance with the adopted *NSWGFA Guidelines for Radio Skeds for Tournaments* as are in effect at the time, these shall be conducted by Tournament Base on 2284 SSB, 80 & 21 VHF. The scheduled times will be Friday at 8.30am, 10.30am, 12.30pm, 2.30pm, 3.30pm and 4.10pm Saturday at 8.00am, 10.00am, 12.00pm, 2.00pm, 4.00pm Sunday 8.00am, 10.00am, 12.00pm, 2.00pm, 3.00pm. All boats must answer each schedule, giving boat number, boat name, accurate fishing report using the 0:0:0 system and fishing position using the supplied grid chart (**Note: Marlin & Shark captures must be radioed into tournament base with accurate measurements using the weight/curve graph**). If a vessel has radio failure and cannot contact radio base or relay through another vessel, it MUST RETURN TO PORT and notify Radio Base of their actions by other means (phone, etc.). Boats MUST keep the air clear 10 minutes prior to the end of fishing for late hook-ups to be recorded to tournament base. ALL VESSELS MUST SIGN OFF WITH TOURNAMENT BASE ON RETURN TO PORT – or penalties will apply.

If a vessel misses two (2) radio Skeds, the tournament base will commence emergency procedures.

19. CAPTURE CERTIFICATES AND TAG & RELEASE CARDS

All capture or tag & releases are to be reported accurately by radio to Tournament Base when effected and the time given by Tournament Base recorded on the tag & release card/capture certificates. If captured or tagged & released during sked, the skipper is entitled to record his/her time **IN THE EVENT OF NOT BEING ABLE TO CONTACT TOURNAMENT BASE, PLEASE CONTACT YOUR NEAREST VESSEL.**

FAILURE TO RECORD THE TIME AND LINE CLASS OF AN EFFECTED CAPTURE OR TAG & RELEASE WILL RESULT IN A TIME RECORDED FOR THE CAPTURE OR TAG & RELEASE AS BEING THE END OF FISHING ON EACH DAY, LINE CLASS WILL BE 60KG. All captures or tag & release cards must be lodged at the Weigh Station on the day of capture or tag & release and on Sunday 15th February no later than **4.00pm** for fish reported as a hook up prior to the end of fishing. All hand deliveries of equipment and Tag Cards must be at the Weigh station facility by the 5.00pm deadline. (**Weigh station will be Fly Point**) **Please note that NSW DPI tags only will be accepted. Billfish tags must be used to tag all billfish species. The appropriate flags are to be flown on return to the weigh station.**

20. METHOD OF RELEASING A TAGGED FISH

The hook is to be removed, or the leader cut as close as possible to the fish. A fish is considered tagged and released when the tag is secured to the fish and the fish is released back into the water alive.

21. EVIDENCE OF TAG & RELEASE

All Tag & Release of fish throughout the competition must be accompanied by time and date stamped photographic images. The tournament committee may, at its discretion, review the photographic images at any stage throughout the tournament and amend provisional results accordingly. Failure to provide the images, or images that do not contain the



object of the day (Photographic evidence), will result in zero points being allocated to the tag and release. The object to be used in photographic equipment for day one of fishing may be randomly selected, in which case it will be announced at the briefing night. The object of the day to be used for photographic equipment on day two will be announced at the commencement of the 1710 sked at the end of day one's fishing. Images provided to the tournament committee as evidence of the tag and release must be date stamped.

Smallfry/Junior anglers maybe requested to demonstrate their proficiency in handling a rod and reel outfit

22. BOAT / ANGLER REPLACEMENT

No replacement of boats or anglers for whatever reason will be allowed after the conclusion of the briefing on Thursday 12th February 7.00 pm (**Any alterations and additions to entry form can be made at the briefing**). Anglers may only affect a capture or tag & release on the vessel on which he or she is a registered angler.

23. TROPHY PRESENTATION DINNER

The Trophy Presentation Evening will be held at **Soldiers Point Bowling Club 118 Soldiers Point Rd, Soldiers Point NSW 2317**, Sunday 15th February 2026, commencing at 7:30 pm.

Please Note: You must be present to claim any angler or boat draws

24. BAD WEATHER

To avoid taking unnecessary risks in the event of bad weather, the Tournament Committee will decide whether the day will be a competition day or not. In the event of bad weather developing after the start of fishing, the Tournament Committee will decide whether the competition day will be called off for the remainder of that day. All fish captured or tagged prior to this time will be eligible for the competition. The Tournament Committee accepts no responsibility for decisions made by individuals as to whether to put them to sea or not, having regard to the Tournament Committee's decision on fishing for the day. The declaration of a gale warning by the Bureau of Meteorology will cancel fishing for that day: Cancellation will only apply until the Gale Warning is lifted. In the event of a declaration whilst vessels are at sea fishing will cease immediately and vessels must return to port.

25. INDEMNITY

THE N&PSGFC accepts no responsibility for actions by entrants in this tournament & shall not be held liable for any damage or loss to any property or person during this tournament. In that regard, all entrants indemnify the tournament committee, N&PSGFC & all voluntary workers against any claim for loss or damage to property or person.

26. SEVERABILITY

If any provision or provisions of these rules are declared unenforceable or invalid, the remaining provisions will continue to be valid and enforceable.

27. ACCEPTANCE OF TOURNAMENT RULES

By signing the application to enter the form and/or paying the entry fee(s) described in rule 3 applicants will be deemed to have accepted the tournament rules without limitation or amendment. (Refer Rule 3 Entries/Eligibility)







"A" ENTRIES

1. **NSWGFA CLUBS** are invited to nominate **TEAMS of 3 boats**, each of which **MUST** be registered and compliant with all NSW Roads and Maritime Services (NSWRMS) safety equipment requirements with that Member Club. Any boats not in Club teams will be grouped by NSWGFA into teams of **3 boats** to fish as a composite team, where possible composite teams will be made up of boats from the same zone area. If any one of the composite teams wins a team trophy in the 2026 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament, then the trophy will be awarded to the Club represented by the highest point scoring boat in that team. (**Minimum of 2 boats will constitute a team**)
2. **NSWGFA** reserves the right to refuse entry to the Tournament.
3. **ANGLERS** entering the 2026 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament **MUST** be full financial members (or Life Members) of a Club affiliated with NSWGFA. For this tournament, an angler is a financial club member from the date of receipt of their completed Membership Application form and dues by his/her Club Executive. **The Boat Captain and all crew involved in the capture or the tag and release (anglers, boat skippers, wire/trace man, gaffer or tagger) of a fish must be registered/paid angler.**
4. **ENTRY FEES** is \$120.00 (incl. GST) for each competing adult angler and \$50.00 (incl. GST) for each junior angler (under 16 years of age at the commencement of the tournament) and small fry angler (under 11 years of age at the commencement of the tournament). There must be a minimum of two (2) Adult registered persons on board each boat under 8 metres and three (3) Adult registered persons on board each boat 8 metres and over. There is a minimum entry fee of \$240.00 (incl. GST) for each boat under 8 metres and a minimum entry fee of \$360.00 (incl. GST) for each boat 8 metres and over. **Completed entry forms together with proof of insurance as stated in Rule "A" 5 and fees MUST be forwarded to your CLUB SECRETARY by 31st January 2026.** Incomplete entry forms will be rejected, and **MAY attract a late entry fee of \$100.** Anyone who participates in the tag and/or capture of a fish must be a registered angler in the tournament.
5. **INSURANCE** – each vessel is to have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance and Boat Owner **MUST** provide details of insurance covering third party property liability and third-party personal liability insurance on the *Boat Safety Rescue form*.
6. **LATE ENTRY FEE** of \$100.00 (incl. GST) will apply to boat entries received after the closing date 18th February 2026. Late entries will be accepted only at the discretion of NSWGFA and must be registered before 6.30pm Wednesday 18th February 2026.
7. **ADDITIONAL ANGLERS & BOATS** – will not be accepted after briefing Thursday 19th February 2026 for additional anglers & boats.
8. **NO MAJOR TEAM/BOAT CHANGES** after 19th February 2026.
9. **NO REFUND** of entry fees for whatever reason will be considered after 19th February 2026
10. **VISITING ANGLER TEAMS**
 - (a) Interstate teams of anglers must consist of a minimum of two (2) adult anglers per boat under 8 metres and three (3) adult anglers per boat over 8 metres, each angler must be a financial member of a club affiliated with a State Member Association of GFAA.
 - (b) International teams must consist of a minimum of two (2) adult anglers per boat under 8 metres and three (3) adult anglers per boat over 8 metres; each angler must be an overseas resident financial member of IGFA or a financial member of an international game fishing club that is affiliated with IGFA.
 - (c) Visiting anglers and visiting boats as per "A" ENTRIES 10 (a) & (b) (i.e., anglers not affiliated with NSWGFA Inc. Member Clubs and Boats not on NSWGFA Club register) shall only compete for trophies as listed in **VISITING ANGLER & VISITING BOAT TROPHIES** section on **page 10**. **Note:** Visiting anglers and boats are not entitled to fish for NSWGFA Angler, NSWGFA Team and Boat Trophies in this competition.
 - (d) Entry form is to be completed and returned direct to NSWGFA – PO Box 730, Nelson Bay NSW 2315 (**Visiting Teams Only**).



"B" TOURNAMENT RULES

1. **THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE** to conduct the competition shall comprise of the NSWGFA Executive, Tournament Radio Communications Officer & 1 NPSGFC Representative.
2. **MISCONDUCT** – the Tournament Committee may on its own initiative investigate and act upon any incident of misconduct by any person on a boat, be he/she registered for the tournament or not occurring during the tournament. The Committee may impose penalties of loss of points, disqualification of fish, angler, boat or team and refusal of entry to any future NSWGFA Interclub Tournaments. All competitors are reminded that as members of a Club they are regarded as representatives of that Club, as such, any unbecoming behaviour reflects adversely on that Club and indeed on all Game Fishers, hence, **the Tournament Committee reserves the right to take any action it deems necessary in these circumstances.**
3. It is an expectation that all participants will conduct themselves in a responsible and courteous manner to Tournament Officials and other Competitors always throughout the Tournament. Penalties for misconduct may include disqualification from the Tournament.
4. **PROTESTS** – any protest relative to a capture or tag & release must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary. Protests **MUST** be lodged no later than 9.00 pm on the day of the incident concerned except last day which is 6.30pm.
Note: the tournament committee has the right to act on any breach of any tournament rule whether a protest is lodged.
5. **REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION** of a penalty imposed by the Tournament Committee must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary no later than 8.00 pm on the day following the incident concerned. (Except on Sunday the last day when the time for a request for reconsideration is 7.00pm).
6. **ALL 2026 NSWGFA INTERCLUB TOURNAMENT DECISIONS AND RULINGS ARE FINAL AND BINDING ON ALL ENTRANTS.**
7. **NON mandatory BRIEFING will be held at Soldiers Point Bowling Club from 6.00pm Thursday 19th February (PRESIDENTS SHOUT)**, an Online briefing will be broadcast on Wednesday 18th February 2026 at 7.00 pm. It is compulsory for 1 crew member to register their attendance at either one of these events. A member from each boat will need to attend the briefing to collect their boats tournament satchel.
8. **NO REPLACEMENT OF BOATS AND COMPETITORS** will be allowed after the commencement of the briefing. Anglers may not effect a capture or tag & release on any other vessel than the vessel he/she is registered on. Captured fish, tag & release card, the angler, all equipment used in the capture or tag must be presented to the weigh station on the vessel on which the capture or tag & release was effected and may not be transferred to another vessel however in the case of an emergency the Tournament Committee may at their discretion allow the transfer of an angler/fish and equipment used to affect the capture or tag.
SEAWORTHINESS OF BOATS All boats must comply with NSWRMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home Club. A "Boat Safety Rescue form" is included as part of the entry form and must be completed and signed by the Boat Skipper. All boats must carry a **406 MHz EPIRB** and have two working marine radios fitted one of which must be **VHF** frequency.
9. **BOAT NUMBERS** supplied are to be prominently displayed on both sides of the cabin. **Any alteration of the Sponsors boat numbers will impose a penalty. See page 8 "F" Penalties.**
10. **SAIL PAST** – There will be no Sail past, Tournament base will call start fishing at 8am Friday 20th Feb.
11. **STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS – all boats must comply with NSWRMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home club.** All competitors are reminded of the requirement for a NSW DPI licence and bag limits when fishing.
12. **FISHING DAYS & TIMES**
Friday 20th, Saturday 21st & Sunday 22nd February. On **Friday 20th February**, fishing will commence at 8.00am Game Fish Base will announce start fishing on this day. **On the other fishing days starting time will be at 8.00 am and Fishing shall finish at 4.00 pm on Friday and Saturday, on the last day fishing will finish at 3pm**, all fish and tag cards must be presented at the weigh station on the day the fish was tagged excluding Sunday. Any fished hooked and reported to Game Fish Base prior to finish time may be played out and if caught will be eligible for the tournament provided the angler, fish and/or tag and full equipment is presented to the weigh station by 5.00pm on Sunday 22nd February.
Weigh station will be deemed FLY POINT.



13. FISHING AREA (TOURNAMENT BOUNDARIES)

The Fishing area for the tournament is South to latitude 33 degrees 15 minutes (Bird Island) and North to latitude 32 degrees and 13 minutes (Latitude Rock)

14. LEAVING AND ENTERING THE PORT – Boats must leave Port Stephens on each tournament day and return to Port Stephens on completion of fishing. The safety organisation for competing boats is considered paramount to the advantage that could be gained by some boats staying out overnight. Boats that elect to continue fishing after hours are to report this to Game Fish Base and sign off for the day. Any boat in transit is required to enter Port Stephens and report to the Game Fish Base before leaving port to commence fishing. All boats must report by radio to Game Fish Base on return to port. If unable to make radio, contact with Game Fish Base they then must report to a member of the Tournament Committee at the weigh station before going to the mooring/trailer. **Any Breach of this regulation will incur a penalty – see page 8 “F” – Penalties.****15. NO WASH** – apart from “No Wash” areas applying in the port by statutory authorities a specific tournament “NO WASH” area prevails between the inner light at Nelson Head and the Tournament Weigh station. **Any breach of this regulation will incur a penalty – see page 8 “F” – Penalties.****16. BAD WEATHER** – to avoid taking unnecessary risks in the event of bad weather the Tournament Committee will decide whether the day will be a competition day or not. Boats should establish early morning contact from 6.00am with Game Fish Base or members of the Tournament Committee at the weigh station. In the event of bad weather developing after the start of fishing then the NSWGFA President and the Interclub Tournament Committee will confer and decide whether the competition will be called off for the remainder of the day. All fish caught prior to this time will be eligible for the competition. Note: A declaration of a Gale Warning by the appropriate government weather authority requires the cancellation of the tournament. In the event of a declaration whilst vessels are at sea, such vessels are required to cease fishing immediately and return to port. Cancellation will only apply until the Gale Warning is Lifted. The Tournament Committee accepts no responsibility for decisions made by individuals whether to put to sea or not, having regard to the Committee’s decision on the Tournament for the day. The ultimate decision on return to harbour remains with the competitors.**17. 2026 NSWGFA INTERCLUB TOURNAMENT AWARDS**

At the conclusion of the 2026 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament on Sunday 22nd February 2026 an Awards Presentation will be held at the Soldiers Point Bowling Club, commencing at 7.30 pm. **(Ticket price includes 2 course meal and some refreshments @ \$75 Each per person)** At this function Provisional Winners will be announced and presented with Tournament Trophy Mementos. Boat Captains/Anglers are encouraged to purchase their tickets for themselves and friends when completing Entry Form. All Presentation tickets MUST BE paid for no later than 6.00 pm Saturday 21st February 2026 only those with pre-paid tickets will gain entry to Presentation Dinner.

"C" FISHING RULES

The 2026 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament will be fished under the "Fishing Rules and Tackle Regulations" of the GFAA and NSWGFA as are in effect at the time. Note: The Tag & Release rules also are published by NSWGFA and will apply, in addition NSWGFA point scores, fishing rules and minimum weights will apply.

1. **LINE CLASSES – which** will be recognised, are 4kg (no sharks), 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg.

(a) CAPTURE - Adult Angler MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY

(b) MARLIN must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class and over.

Black, Blue & Striped Marlin

(c) YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA – 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line and for Junior Anglers equal to line class in all cases.

(d) SHARKS must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 130kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class. **Blue Sharks (New Minimum weights see below)**, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), **Tiger (New minimum weights see below)**, Whaler (all)

Tiger Sharks. New Min. Weights

Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 120kg

Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 200kg

Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 250kg

Blue Sharks. New Min. Weights -

Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 100kg

Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 125kg

Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 150kg

(e) OTHER GAME FISH must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used.

Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi

**** Junior Angler personal points only – Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. Striped Tuna Catch & Release Only Same Points Apply**

SHARKS – No Sharks will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place.

(f) MARLIN – The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

Junior and Small Fry Angler Minimum Weights

(g) CAPTURE - MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY

(h) MARLIN must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class and over.

Black, Blue & Striped Marlin

(i) YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA – Equal to line class in all cases.

(j) SHARKS must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 120kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class.

Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Whaler (all)

(k) OTHER GAME FISH must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used.

Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi

**** Junior Angler personal points only – Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. – Measure & Release Only Same Points Apply**

SHARKS – No Sharks will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place.

(l) MARLIN – The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

THE METHOD OF RELEASING TAGGED FISH -The hook is to be removed or the leader cut as close as possible to the fish

- (a) **POINTS** will be awarded as per NSWGFA Tag & Release point score.
- (b) **CIRCLE HOOKS ONLY** are permitted to be used for live baiting and trolling natural baits (whether live, dead, mutilated or dissected). Except in the case of targeting Narrow Barred Mackerel (Scomberomorus Commerson) NB: no points to be scored for any species caught while using live baits and/or trolling natural baits with "J" hooks.



- (c) **BILLFISH TAG** – all billfish must be tagged with the billfish tag; this is the only tag that will be recognised for billfish in this tournament. The billfish tag is for billfish only point score i.e. no other species.
- (d) **ELIGIBLE SPECIES** – as per tag & release point score table – copy of which is in boat satchel. **Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Great White, Whaler (all)**
- (e) **LINE CLASS** - **must** be provided on tag & release forms and cards. If no line class is provided it will be deemed to have been caught on 60kg tackle.
- (f) **TIME** - Failure to record time of release on the tag card will result in the time being recorded as at the end of the days fishing or after the last fish for the day has been tagged, whichever is the latter.

3. "D" OPERATIONS

- (a) **COMMUNICATIONS** – radio schedules will be conducted as per the NSWGFA adopted “Guidelines for Radio Scheds” as are in affect at the time. **Compulsory log on from 6:00am**. Due to safety of boat and anglers the radio communications will be recorded from the start of fishing and will cease when the last boat returns to port. “Game Fish Base” will operate on **VHF 80 /21. The Base will announce “Start Fishing” each morning and will relay the latest weather information whenever available. Radio Schedules will be conducted every TWO hours with the first schedule 9.10am, 11.10am, 1.10pm, 3.10pm and the Final Schedule at 4.10pm with ETR.** (Minute silence at 1.09pm on Sunday 22nd February, radio silence unless of Mayday situation) Competitors are requested to advise “Game Fish Base” of the number of persons on board when they sign on by answering the first schedule. Boats will be called in numerical order, regardless of type of radio they have, and the Base will acknowledge each reply by repeating the report on both frequencies so that all competitors will be aware of all reports. Boats are to report on each schedule as follows: (i) Boat Number; (ii) Boat Name; (iii) Position (using grid map references); (iv) whether Trolling, Drifting or Anchored; (v) **Accurate Fishing Report** using the “000” system, i.e. Strikes, Hook-ups, Captures. If possible, boats are to give Species for Strikes and Hook-ups which are not landed. All boats are to report on every schedule. In the interests of safety, communication on each schedule is compulsory. **Failure to answer two (2) consecutive radio schedules will incur a penalty – see page 8 – “F” Penalties.** In the event of a boat suffering radio failure then they must make contact with another competing boat and have them advise Game Fish Base of the problem at the next schedule and immediately return to port. Boats must maintain RADIO SILENCE for 10 minutes before FINISH FISHING TIME to allow for reports of late hook-ups. Friday & Saturday on the 4.10pm schedule and on Sunday the Final day 3.10pm schedule, boats are requested to advise Base of total tag and release or captures for the day. All boats are to sign off with “Game Fish Base” when they enter port at the end of the days fishing. If unable to make radio contact, then they must report to a Tournament Committee member at the weigh station before proceeding to their moorings/trailer.
- (b) **MAYDAY/PANPAN**, if a mayday is called the radio operator will communicate the severity of the MAYDAY to the NSWGFA president it will be the decision of the NSWGFA president whether to suspend fishing.
- (c) **Failure to report on return to port will invoke a penalty – see page 8 – “F” Penalties.** All boats are requested to avoid chatter on tournament frequencies. If competitors wish to talk to each other, please use another frequency and leave the tournament frequencies clear for safety and/or tournament business only. **Inappropriate radio use is not only an offence under the Communications Act but will incur a penalty – see page 8 “F” – Penalties.**
- (d) **WEIGHSTATION CONTROL AND PROCEDURES** – Only the angler is allowed onto the weigh station whilst the fish is being processed. **Note: Angler & Crew will be given permission to come onto the weigh station for photo purpose at the appropriate time.** Once the boats enter the Nelson Bay inner harbour, they are to proceed slowly between the weigh station and the two (2) fixed poles to obtain acknowledgement from the Dock master and be placed in order for processing as required. The Dock master reserves the right to bring boats alongside out of turn for the quick and orderly management of the area. Before coming alongside the weigh station boats must have completed and be ready for presentation all capture and/or tag & release forms. All tackle used in capture or tag & release must be ready for presentation to weigh station officials together with the angler i.e. the rod & reel, line, hook(s), terminal tackle, gaff(s), tail



rope(s) etc. In the event of a dispute regarding a capture and/or tag being rejected, the tackle used will be retained by the Chief Judge pending a resolution. Any angler wishing to "walk" gear etc. to weigh station must first obtain permission from the gate security officer prior to entering the Weigh station.

- (e) **CAPTURE and TAG & RELEASE DOCUMENTATION** – all captures and tag & release presented to the weigh station MUST be accompanied by correctly completed documentation. The white Tournament Capture/T&R form, provided to each boat, must be used and must include BOAT NAME, BOAT NUMBER, ANGLER NUMBER, DATE, and TIME & LINE CLASS of capture/tag. **Failure to record time of capture and/or tag on the return will result in the time being recorded as at the end of the days fishing or the time last fish was tagged whichever is the latter, failure to record line class will result in a 60kg line class recorded.**
- (f) **IDENTIFICATION OF SPECIES** – in the event of any dispute regarding species of fish the decision of the Tournament Committee shall be final.
- (g) **CAPTURES**
 - (ii) **SCIENTISTS** – It has been the practice of the Association to invite Research Scientists to the weigh station to gather measurements, weights and samples from fish weighed in. Only Scientists that have NSWGFA accreditation will be allowed access to the weigh station to gather information. These people will be officially identifiable. Anglers are requested to co-operate with these people and no other scientists.
 - (iii) **FISH** – may not be left at the weigh station, but must be taken by boat **well clear of Port Stephens – Great Lakes Marine Park** and disposed of in an appropriate manner - If a vessel is unable to safely dispose of a fish on the day of capture, the boat captain must seek direction on the appropriate course of action from the NSWGFA President. (Safety of the crew is paramount - if the boat is incapable of disposing of the fish safely you must inform a tournament official to organise an alternative) **Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the capture.** Competitors must not clean or fillet fish or remove shark jaws near the weigh station, beaches, marinas or places frequented by the public. Fish carcasses must not be hung off boats, moorings or marinas. If required, traces to be removed at the weigh station by or at the direction of a Tournament Committee member. Shark jaws to be removed on board boats only. Small boats to utilise larger boats if necessary. All boats must empty burley pots before entering the port. **Penalties will be imposed for any breach of these rules – see page 8 "F" Penalties In the event of any shark or marlin given away for eating, only the fillets may be given, and the remaining carcass is the responsibility of the skipper and crew.**
- (h) **SALE OF FISH** – Competitors are reminded that it is illegal for recreational or un-licensed anglers to sell their catches. The following rule has been adopted by the Association: "That any fish weighed for NSWGFA Trophies shall not be sold or bartered. Such fish shall be ineligible for any trophies or awards of the Association". **Anyone found to have sold their catch will be disqualified from the tournament. BAG LIMITS – All anglers must abide by the current NSW Government laws on bag limits.**
- (i) **MEDIA** – only media representatives accredited by the NSWGFA and officially identifiable will be allowed access to the weigh station. Anglers should note that **ONLY the NSWGFA President** shall make any statements to the media. The NSWGFA logo, NSWGFA (name) or Official Tournament Name cannot be used in any media publication (including internet websites) without the express permission of the NSWGFA. **Any breach of this rule can invoke a penalty – see page 8 – "F" Penalties.**
- (j) **Port Stephens – Great Lakes Marine Park** – The NSW Marine Park regulations (including Marine Park Permit special conditions) must be adhered to by all competitors. **Any breach of these regulations and special permit conditions may incur a tournament penalty – see page 8 – "F" Penalties Misconduct.**

Radio schedules will be called, and procedures will be as for the major weekend competition. Minimum weight rules apply. All captures and tag & release paperwork need to be presented to the weigh station prior to 4.30pm to be eligible – weigh station will open at 2.00 pm. **INDIVIDUAL LYNDY GRIEVES MEMORIAL TROPHIES ONLY**

5. "F" PENALTIES

Note: Penalties WILL APPLY to BOTH Capture and Tag & Release Points

- (a) **MISCONDUCT** – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see "B" Tournament Rules – Rule 2.
- (b) **ALTERATION OF BOAT NUMBERS** – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see "B" Tournament Rules – Rule 9
- (c) **FAILURE TO SIGN OFF ON RETURN TO PORT** – loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points – see "B" Tournament Rules – see Rule D" Operations – Rule (c).
- (d) **BREACH OF NO WASH RULE** – loss of 2,000 capture & 2,000 tag & release points – see "B" Tournament Rules – Rule 15
- (e) **FAILURE TO ANSWER TWO (2) CONSECUTIVE RADIO SCHEDULES & INAPPROPRIATE RADIO USAGE** – loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points – see "D" Operations – Rule (a).
- (f) **FISH DISPOSAL** – Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the fish – see "e" Operations – Rule (g) (iii)
- (g) **DISCHARGE OF WASTE OR RUBBISH** – Non-compliance with current NSWWRMS regulations will attract a loss of 2,000 capture and 2,000 tag & release points.
- (h) **SALE OF FISH** – disqualification from tournament – see f Operations (h)
- (i) **BREACH OF MEDIA RULE** – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see g Operations – (i)

Notwithstanding the above penalties, the Tournament Committee reserves the right in any circumstance to disqualify any capture, angler or boat for disregarding any 2026 NSWGFA Interclub Tournament rule or instructions.
